Agreement for collaboration between NIED, Kutchan Town and Niseko Town to enhance the disaster resilience against snow and ice-related disasters including avalanche

NIED (President: Haruo Hayashi), Kuchan Town (Mayor: Kazushi Monji) and Niseko Town (Mayor: Kenya Katayama) have agreed to sign the collaboration agreement concerning the reinforcement of collaborative efforts to prevent snow and ice-related disasters typified by the avalanche accidents in Niseko area. The signing ceremony will be taken place on March 22 of 2019 as follows and be open to the press.

Under the umbrella of this agreement, NIED, Kutchan Town and Niseko Town will promote to enhance scientific and practical initiatives, and contribute to the research and development of avalanche accident prevention.


Snow and Ice Research Center in NIED

It is our aim to provide a secure and comfortable life in the face of the challenges brought on by the heavy snowfall that encompasses more than half of our country. Living in this harsh winter environment requires that we cope with difficult winter conditions and the associated disasters that occur annually. Such disasters may even take place on Japan's Pacific side. The frequency and severity of hazards with which we must deal change from year to year because of increasing vehicle usage and global warming. The National Research Institute for Earth Science and Disaster Resilience (NIED) has established the Snow and Ice Research Center in order to deal with the social needs that result from the conditions described above. The Snow and Ice Research Center conducts projects on snow and ice related disasters such as avalanches, blowing snow, snow accretion, and the hazards associated with roads in the winter environment.
