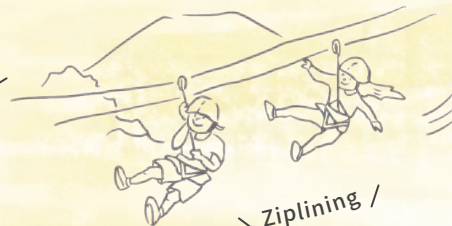

Many unique goods crafted by local artists make the best souvenirs!



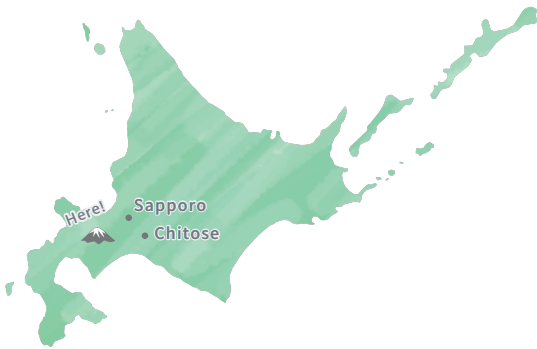
Local Produce
